


## EU SUPPORT TO CT AND P/CVE PROJECTS:

  - » West Africa





## ABOUT CT-MORSE

CT MORSE is a European Union (EU) funded project providing coordination, monitoring and knowledge, as well as technical and implementation support interventions in the areas of counter-terrorism (CT) and preventing and countering violent extremism (P/CVE). It is funded by the EU in third countries under the Instrument contributing to Stability and Peace (IcSP).

Since its establishment in January 2015, CT MORSE has focused on strengthening the global delivery of the various CT and P/CVE projects financed by the EU through improving coordination and coherence, as well as reinforcing EU engagement within the Global Counter Terrorism Forum (GCTF) framework.

CT MORSE's work and activities prioritise themes and regions highlighted in the Council Conclusions on EU External Action on CT from 9 February 2015 and 19 June 2017; the EU Global Strategy of 2016;


the EU CT Strategy of 2005; and the revised EU strategy for combating radicalisation and recruitment to terrorism.

CT MORSE ensures timely and effective support by providing a pool of experts, thematic publications, policy briefs/think pieces, organisation of meetings and events, coordination of capacity building initiatives, and monitoring and evaluation of exercises. It is also responsible for completion of assessment reports on EU CT and P/CVE engagement projects under the IcSP funding instrument. Overall, it supports and enhances visibility of EU actions on CT and P/CVE worldwide.


## EU Support to CT and P/CVE in Partner Countries

Since 2005, the EU has stressed that actions to combat terrorism effectively must be organised around four pillars: prevention, protection, pursuit and response, in line with the European Union Counter-Terrorism Strategy and the European Union Strategy for Combating Radicalisation and Recruitment to Terrorism.

Over the last decade, the European Commission has invested heavily in combating terrorism and violent extremism in partner countries. As of the end of 2019, there are approximately 465-million-euro worth of CT or P/CVE-specific projects (ongoing) with a geographical scope external to the EU, which represents an increase of approximately 61 million euros (or 15%) from similar figures in the previous year – and more than a tripling of



engagement over a four year period. Article 5 of the IcSP represents 21% of the overall EU investment in this area.



## Themes

The EU approach to CT and P/CVE capacity building is to promote criminal justice and law enforcement capabilities while respecting human rights and the rule of law, as well as to support key preventive measures for violent extremism and to counter terrorist financing.

The different strands of the IcSP work follow this logic and focus on :

- ✓ **Building capacity of law enforcement and judiciary agencies**
- ✓ **Preventing and countering violent extremism**
- ✓ **Countering the financing of terrorism**

## Project main activities

The project has an overall global remit, with specific geographic focus in areas which include Middle East, North Africa, West Africa/Sahel, Horn of Africa, Central/South/South East Asia and the Caribbean.

### Liaison, and Information Sharing

To ensure that EU CT and P/CVE interventions are up-to-date with international frameworks, EU policies and guidelines and global lessons learned in the field.

### Visibility

To increase the visibility of the EU and its CT and P/CVE Programmes among EU Member States, target countries, and partners.

### Performance Review & Assessment

To provide recommendations and technical expertise to EU actions on CT and P/CVE all throughout the programme cycle of research, design, implementation and evaluation.

### Coherence and Coordination

To ensure that the EU added value in CT and P/CVE interventions while strengthening coherence and complementarity with broader EU efforts in the security and development areas.

### Evidence-based Advice & Analysis

To provide expert research, analysis and recommendations on current and emerging trends of terrorism and violent extremism, as well as up-to-date indicators from regional and international initiatives in domains relevant to the programme.

### CT Trainings

To deliver a targeted CT training course to relevant EU actors on CT related trends, strategies, tools, and mechanisms in order to design and implement successful CT programmes and projects.
